Project Update



- COVID 19 Response
 - Risk assessments completed
 - Physical distancing (1.5m)
 - Regular office sanitisation
 - Meeting room limits
 - Visitor declaration forms
 - Temperature checks
 - Stay at home if feeling unwell
 - Hand sanitiser and regular hand washing
- Personnel Changes
 - Justine Fisher
- Project Execution Plan
 - Schedule and funding
- Raw Water Pipeline
 - Continue to work with the Lachlan and Forbes Shires on agreement

- 132kV Electrical Transmission Line from Parkes to Site
 - The ETL will supply the required grid connected power to Sunrise for the approved mine life
 - ETL is proposed at 132 kilovolts (kV) requiring a 45m wide corridor
 - ETL will be owned by the network service provider
 - Route options are currently being considered
 - Key stakeholders include:
 - Parkes and Lachlan Shire Councils
 - DPIE – Crown Lands
 - Private landholders
 - TransGrid
 - Essential Energy
 - Transport for NSW
 - Approval sought via Part 5 of the EP&A Act by the network service provider

Community – Working Together

- Sponsorship of Local Agricultural Shows
 - Pending plan to proceed due to Covid
- Education and Investment
 - Supporting the Condobolin Public school through our education sponsorship program to assist with their Breakfast Club
- Fox Baiting Program
 - Commenced early June on ML 1770 with other near neighbours



Voluntary Planning Agreement Funds

- Lachlan Shire Council has constructed a new playground at Gum Bend Lake which is now open to the public
- This playground was funded by:
 - Clean TeQ VPA funds
 - NSW Government “Everyone Can Play” grant
 - Lachlan Shire Council funds




Environmental Annual Reporting

- Annual Review
 - 2019 Annual Review was submitted and accepted by DPIE
 - No non-compliances identified
 - Copy can be found on the Clean TeQ website
- Annual Return
 - Submitted and accepted by NSW EPA
 - No non-compliances identified



Secondary Approvals

- A Mining Lease Compensation Agreement has been signed between Clean TeQ, DPIE-Crown Lands and Local Land Services (LLS) for the use of Crown Land within Mining Lease 1770
- ML 1770 varied to include land to the west of Wilmatha Road for ancillary mining activities
- Water Management Plan has been approved by DPIE
 - copy can be found on the Clean TeQ website
- Noise Management Plan revised
 - Monitoring suspended until construction



- Continuing environmental monitoring in accordance with Development Consent, Environmental Protection Licence and relevant Environmental Management Plans:
 - Air Quality
 - Noise
 - Surface Water
 - Groundwater
- Results are reported on the Clean TeQ website and within the Annual Review
- Particulate Matter monitors (PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5})
 - Installed December 2019
 - Commissioning underway




Vegetation Screens
